Interreg Atlantic Area annual event *Together for blue and green Atlantic regions* 20.10.2021

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Large territory characterized by the prominence of the Atlantic Ocean → Blue in our DNA: common element of the cooperation area – geography, economy and culture

Marine & maritime activities as connection points *e.g.* fishing, aquaculture, agro-industry, renewable energy production, the naval sector, ports



• Sustainable tourism & natural and cultural heritage

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- Climate change and natural risks, particularly coastal and waterways-related risks
- The impact of COVID 19: labour market, inequality, structural change. Need for a cross-cutting approach

The new geography

• Regions from 4 MS: Ireland, France, Portugal and Spain, including the islands Açores, Madeira and Islas Canarias

Territorial analysis

- Extensive territory, mainly composed of regions linked to the Atlantic with many similarities in economic sectors, culture and biodiversity – common challenges
- Significant territorial disparities
- Land-sea link: the Programme's maritime approach involves interactions with inland territories, given the impact they have on coastal areas and on the ocean itself


Analysis of consistency with the main maritime and 2021-2027 planning documents. Are the needs and challenges consistent with these orientations?









In your opinion which are the most important Policy Objectives for the Atlantic Area?





Some general remarks

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Strengthening the **link between coastal and inland areas**: i.e. energy, biodiversity, agri-food, transport, training





ISO1, better governance: proposals to improve articulation with other programmes and non-EU regions.



Coordination with the **Maritime Atlantic Strategy**, even complementing issues not addressed in the AAP 2.0 such as tourism, culture and heritage, nautical activities.



Tourism as a critical element in Atlantic maritime regions and as a transversal element (value chain).



Importance of **ports** as articulating elements of the territory and the economic activity: main fields: digitalisation, circular economy, connectivity between ports.



Potential of the **blue energy** sector to absorb workers from other sectors of the blue economy most impacted by Covid-19, through training and skills.



Closer to the people, + Green, + Blue

Priority areas for intervention - marine and maritime areas, and coastal areas (non-coastal areas exploiting direct links with the coast, in the form of synergy and added value of joint work)



One of the **challenges** for the Atlantic regions and for the AA Programme is the achievement of a **balance** between **sustainable energy** and the **network of protected areas**, **tourism** and the **development of fishing and maritime transport activities**
