Project partnership	X	The project's partnership consists exclusively of local (both municipal and inter-municipal) public entities, since they are the ones that gather the necessary heritage, tourism and culture competencies that guarantee the correct implementation of the project and the sustainability of the actions. Other sectors of activity, such as the tourist sector of the different participating regions, will be incorporated into the project through the WP7 actions, consisting of the organization of fam trips and press trips aimed at raising awareness and involving this sector in the promotion and dissemination of tourist products developed within the project's framework.
Brief summary		
Project description	X	Innovative aspects Through the actions proposed the project seeks to recover these patrimonial elements that belong to the cities' historical heritage through their social appropriation, giving them new uses and recovering a function in their respective communities, which will guarantee their survival and, thereby, prevent the loss of identity of the territories to which they belong. Moreover, the MMIAH project will contribute to transform this problem (disused and abandoned marine, industrial and military installations and equipment) into a tourist asset for the territories. Through the recovery of the "historical memory" preserved by these patrimonial elements and their dissemination and valorisation by means of historical recreation, the singular character, relevance and tourist attraction that these patrimonial element confer the

		cities will be valued, which will result in a potential increase in the number of visitors.

Project budget	X	Budget explanation (I) With regard to infrastructure budgets, it should be clarified that under no circumstances is the project intended to address the construction of new infrastructures; instead, this budget is exclusively aimed at the rehabilitation, recovery and/or adaptation for new uses of existing infrastructures. Regarding the method used for calculating the expenses included in this typology, each partner has considered which infrastructures they would like to act on and how much it could cost. Given that the cost of rehabilitation, in most cases, exceeds the budget that can be included in the project for this type of expenditure, the main beneficiary has asked them to adjust the infrastructure budget to an amount that represents around 20% of each partner's budget. The difference, that is, the remaining budget necessary to develop rehabilitation interventions in the identified MMI assets will be borne by each partner with their own funds. Others	X	Budget explanation (II) With respect to the budget for external experts' expenses, it has been calculated on the basis of the different entities' previous experience in contracting activities with similar characteristics, or by requesting approximate budgets to companies. The contracts for both works of rehabilitation/adaptation to new uses and services will always be awarded to the company with the most economically advantageous proposal (taking into account value-for-money), since in the case of public entities contracts must always adapt to the requirements of public sector contract law (publicity, transparency and free competition), which guarantee the tender is awarded to the most economically advantageous proposal.
